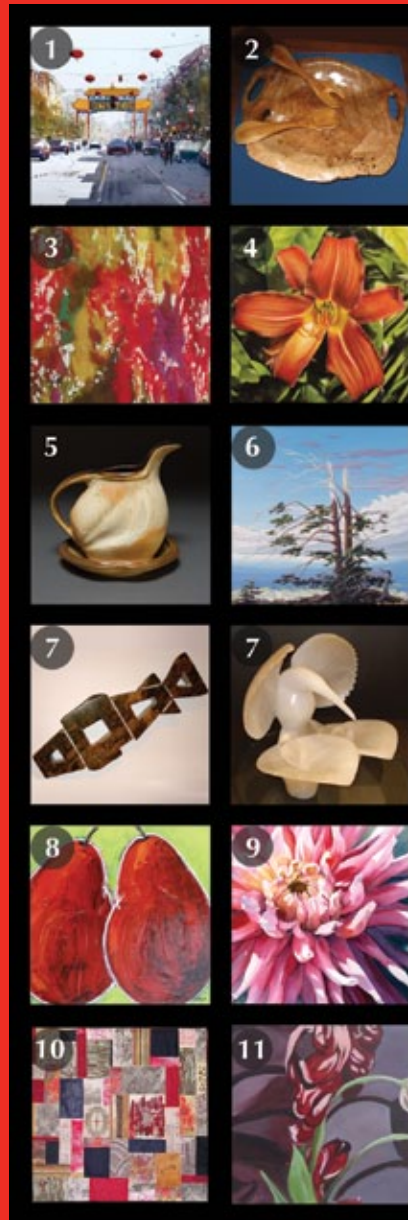

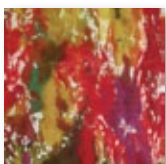
2 JOHN HOLM

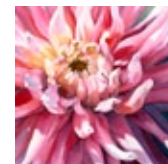

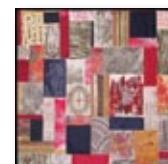

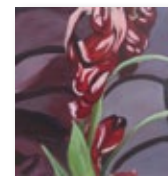
